As this month's issue goes to print, we are excited to announce new plans and direction for the support we provide for the community.

In addition to the existing services that Brunswick CRC brings to the town, we are preparing to launch a 'Staying In Place to Thrive' program in the area. The program will employ local people to help deliver support services to older people in and around Brunswick. As a community partner with the HomeMade organisation, Brunswick CRC will connect and coordinate clients and independent contractors to help keep people living in their own homes and community. This program has been successfully developed with 44 other Community Resource Centres and is now endorsed with support and funding by the Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development.

Whilst still early days, we will soon be conducting a stakeholder consultation with local community members who would be interested in being part of the program.

If you or someone you know would be interested in providing or having support to stay in their own home, please feel welcome to contact Tina on 0422 660 290 or leave your details at the desk at the Resource Centre in Brunswick.

We will be seeking cleaners, gardeners,, drivers with own transport as well as qualified personal care attendants. Clients and workers who are working or living within the Brunswick community will be prioritised and there will also be opportunities for associated services to help support staying local.

While it’s not always easy to find motivation for ourselves, thinking about how our choices affect our loved ones can make all the difference. When the Partridge family from Brunswick's White Rocks Dairy was invited to attend the recent 100th-anniversary celebrations in Perth for Masters Milk, they did not expect to be interviewed for an appearance on Channel 9 Perth news by another Brunswick local!

Michael, Leanne and Harrison Partridge represented White Rocks Dairy, with Harrison being the fourth generation to carry on the farm established in 1887. Michael was interviewed by Brunswick-raised Bianca Carbone, who attended St Michael's School with Harrison and his sister Oaklee. Bianca's university studies have led her to journalism roles in the north of WA, interstate and now at Channel 9 Perth. Bianca commented that she was very pleased to interview someone from her hometown on this special occasion for WA, with Michael saying in the interview that he was proud of the farm's association with the Masters brand over the past 50-plus years.

A number of Masters Milk's historical production items were on display at the celebration, held at the WA Museum, with Michael advising that similar milk production artefacts can be seen in the White Rocks Museum, available for tourists to view during opening hours.

Apart from producing whole milk, Masters is the largest flavoured milk brand in WA, supporting farms from Albany to Perth and famous for its coloured Masters Cow mascots!
