#### THANK YOU NOLA MARGRET CARBONE

"Thank you, I've tried my best every day". This was the heartfelt reply from Mrs Nola Marino MHR, when thanked and congratulated by locals after announcing her retirement from politics.

"Brunswick's Favourite Daughter" will officially retire from her 17-year role as the Liberal Member for Forrest at the next Federal election, expected to be held mid-2025.

Nola was raised in Brunswick, daughter of community stalwarts Alma and Sam Catalano. Once married, she and her husband Charlie lived and worked on their farm in Harvey while raising their two children. They also became active members of the community, with one of Nola's roles being president of Harvey Bulls Football Club. Nola has received a number of awards including Rural Woman of the Year. Premier's Australia Day Active Citizenship Award and certificates for outstanding community service. Nola was elected to the Forrest electorate in 2007, having since been reelected five times and establishing a reputation as a "grass-roots" politician who relates to the community. She is the Shadow Assistant Minister for Education and has held a number of committee places and roles, including a ministerial appointment as Assistant Minister for Regional Development and Territories. #### COUNTRY WOMEN'S ASSOCIATION JUDY TALBOT

The Country Women's Association in Western Australia celebrated its Centenary in 2024 and to acknowledge this milestone, a beautiful book titled Women of Spirit was written. Brunswick is acknowledged and we had the third State President of the Association Mrs Clare Burt. In 1929 Clare and Archie Burt and their four children purchased the Monastery in Brunswick and took up residence.

Mrs Burt was already aware of the CWA and called a meeting to discuss forming a Branch in the Town.

The inaugural meeting was held in the Memorial Hall on November 17th 1932, and until the Branch acquired its own Rest Room the Meetings were held in the Westralian Farmers Cheese Factory. In 1935 the Rest Rooms were erected, opposite the Brownes Factory, and over the years Junior Farmers, Red Cross, Infant Health and the Blood Bank were among organizations who all utilised the building.

During her term in office, Clare received numerous meritorious awards which included the King's Medal in 1937, and Life Membership of the Brunswick CWA in 1936

She was elected State President in 1934 and again in 1938.

In 1940 the family relocated to Perth, but the Brunswick CWA was a driving force in the community.

Sadly the building was pulled down when upkeep became too much and costly.

A plaque denotes where it once stood.

I have fond memories of Junior Farmer Meetings and several Field Days, and Red Cross Meetings held in that building.

If you have been to the resource centre recently (in the last 2 months, or so), you would have noticed one or two changes. Yes, we have been upgrading the front of the building with the support of the Shire of Harvey who have helped to fund the new, bright appearance of the Centre. Long overdue, but we are now feeling refreshed with a colour scheme that happens to blend in with the new mural and also the recently painted St. John Ambulance Sub-Centre in Brunswick - the ambulance crews might need to do a second take when they pull into Ridley Street! Labour has been provided by the Bunbury Prison Pre-Release Unit and we thank their supervisor, Colin for coordinating the work and also we thank the team of our own volunteers who have been there to ensure the workers are kept hydrated and fed during the extreme conditions of the summer heat. Next in line for attention is the front garden area, or rather the desert that it has evolved into! With persistent problems of an old retic system, we have now gained approval and goahead from our lease holders, the Shire of Harvey to redesign the front area. Based on a water-wise design, the finished garden will feature drought-resistant plants alongside installations that will be inclusive and representative of our community groups. With the aim of creating a path with stepping stones made by organisations in Brunswick, this part of the project will take a while to complete and we hope to coordinate the work in a timeframe that will meet the change of season and cooler weather. Rest assured, we should be looking pretty dapper for 2025 and the celebrations of our 20th anniversary - more about that to follow in the next edition of the Moospaper - watch this space!






